



September 30 will mark the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation — an annual commemoration honouring the children, survivors, families, and communities affected by residential schools.

This year, CLSA will be open on September 30, and visitors are encouraged to wear orange shirts or ribbons.

### **What is Orange Shirt Day?**

Orange Shirt Day began as a legacy of the 2013 St. Joseph Mission Residential School Commemoration Project and Reunion held in Williams Lake, BC. Phyllis (Jack) Webstad told the story of how she was excited to be wearing a new orange shirt her grandmother had bought for her for the first day of school, only to have all of her clothes taken and never returned.
